

Covid-19 Vaccine Clinics

The TCCHD has been and continues to work diligently against the Covid-19 virus and Pandemic within Trumbull County. Throughout the month of December, the TCCHD will hold Covid-19 vaccination clinics throughout all of Trumbull County. Please contact the Nursing division of the TCCHD at 330-675-2489 for details about those clinics. All 3 vaccinations (Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson) are generally available. Covid-19 booster shots are also available!

Covid-19 Testing

Currently the TCCHD has a number of over the counter and home Covid-19 test kits. Anyone interested in receiving at home/over the counter test kits should reach out to the nursing division of the TCCHD at 330-675-2489. Meanwhile, if possible continue to mask, maintain safe distance from others, wash your hands, and get vaccinated. These measures will help protect you from COVID-19.

Covid-19 Data

As of November 4th, 2022:

- The TCCHD has administered approximately 43,233 doses of the Covid-19 Vaccine.
- **20,925** are first doses,
- 17,839 are second doses,
- **3,424** are monovalent first booster doses, **532** are monovalent second booster doses, and **513** are bivalent boosters (original and Omicron),
- 191 doses of the COVID vaccine have been administered since the last board meeting,
- The TCCHD uses the CDC Covid-19 Community Levels tool to recommend what prevention steps to take. Levels can be Low, Medium, or High.
- Currently, Trumbull County, Ohio is High.
- Prevention steps include:

Staying up-to-date with Covid-19 vaccines, getting tested if you have symptoms, and if you are at a high risk for severe illness, talk to your healthcare provider about whether or not to wear a mask and take other precautions, and wear a mask indoors in public.

 As of 11/06/2022, Trumbull County has a case rate of 207.1 per 100,000, and a positivity rate of 9.0%.

Recently, Trumbull County was upgraded from medium to high on the CDC Community Level Tool. This is due in-part to the number of hospitalizations related to Covid-19, and how many new cases of Covid-19 the county has had in the last week. Please remember that a main line of defense against spreading Covid-19 is testing. The TCCHD (as stated above) has tests available for the general public. Please remember that if you are sick with Covid-19 symptoms, and (or) test positive for Covid-19, you should stay home and isolate yourself for five days from the time of symptom manifestation.

- Toys should not have sharp edges or points, and be sturdy enough to withstand reasonable impact without breaking, being crushed etc.
- Look for labels that assure the toy has passed some type of quality and or safety inspection,
- Try to pair appropriate safety gear with gifts, for example pair a bike with a helmet.

Measles on the rise in Ohio!

Some areas within Ohio are experiencing an increase in Measles cases. Measles is viral infection that's serious for small children, while also being very preventable by a vaccine. Measles is spread through the air by respiratory droplets from coughing and sneezing, and the symptoms usually don't show up until 10-14 days after exposure. Symptoms include cough, runny nose, inflamed eyes, sore throat, fever, and red blotchy skin rash.

Once the infection sets in, there is no specific antiviral treatment for measles, so the best course of action is prevention steps including getting the MMR vaccine. The TCCHD wishes everyone a safe and healthy holiday season.

Measles

Some people think of measles as just a little rash and fever that clears up in a few days but measles is very contagious and can cause serious health complications, especially it children younger than 5 years of age.

Your child needs two doses of MMR vaccine for best protection

The first dose at 12 through 15 months of age

The second dose at 4 through 6

If your child has not been fully vaccinated against measles, has any symptoms, or you or your child could have been exposed, please contact your healthcare provider.



Before the rash appears, children with measles











Tiny white spots may appear inside the mouth.



Measles symptoms don't appear until 10 to 12 days after exposure. These symptoms tend to get worse during the first 1 to 3 days of the illness. Rash typically starts at the hairline and moves down, with the face breaking out first.
